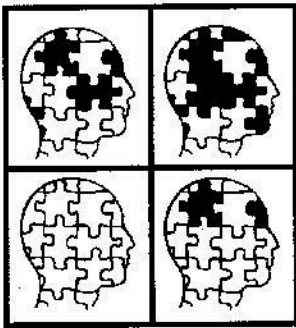

Did you realize that . . . ?

- . . . a concussion is a type of brain injury
- . . . each year in the United States there
are an estimated 2.5 million TBI related
Emergency Departments visits (TBI)¹
- . . . over 812,000 of those TBI related
Emergency Department visits are
children
- . . . the risk of brain injury is highest
among:
 - Children – 0 to 4
 - Individuals – 15 to 24
 - Adults over age 75
- . . . the main causes of TBI are:
 - Falls
 - Assaults/Struck By
 - Motor Vehicle – Traffic
- . . . most concussions occur without loss
of consciousness
